Veterinary Hours: Wednesday - Saturday 8:00AM - 6:00PM Appointment scheduling: Tuesday - Saturday 8:00AM - 5:00PM

- All services are offered by appointment only. We cannot accept walk-ins at this time.
- For safety, all pets must be kept on leash or in a carrier while at Pet Network. If you do not have a carrier or leash you may purchase one for \$5.
- Please bring any medical records available to the appointment or email them to <u>communityhospital@petnetwork.org</u> prior to the appointment.
- Please bring all medications your pet is currently receiving, including any dietary supplements.
- If you are late to your appointment you may be asked to reschedule.
- A deposit may be required to reschedule any missed appointments.
- Multiple no show, no call may be charged for the cost of the exam.
- Appointments are limited to 3 people (including children) during the exam due to limited space.
- Focus will be on the Pet scheduled for the appointment, if you have questions about another pet in your household we ask that you make a separate appointment to allow for sufficient time to treat each pet.
- All pets must establish care with a Pet Network Veterinarian prior to scheduling technician appointments.

What kind of Appointment do I need?

Urgent Care/ Illness Exams: \$89.00

Urgent care services are for pet owners with a pet in **non-life threatening** condition, seeking urgent medical attention. If your pet is in stable condition but **cannot** wait for a regular veterinary appointment, urgent care is the best option. We offer a limited number of appointments within 48 hours Wednesday through Saturday. Some examples of urgent care are, but are not limited to:

- Minor wounds
- Drop in energy, listless
- Colored nasal discharge
- Lameness or limping
- Diarrhea for more than 24 hours
- Vomiting for more than 12 hours or multiple times a day
- Consistent head shaking or scratching at the ears
- Colored eye discharge/swelling/squinting
- Untreated skin irritations or hot spots
- Pain animal unable to get comfortable

We hope that our new urgent care program provides a valuable service to the community. We strive to offer the best care at affordable prices and hope to expand the hours of this service in the future.

Emergent Care - Same day (Limited availability) \$99.00

Emergent care provides outpatient urgent care services for pets in need of same day urgent medical attention. Emergent care appointments are offered on a first come first served basis and are limited to Veterinarian availability. Wellness Exam, includes COHAT (dental) consultation: \$79.00

A wellness exam is a comprehensive medical examination of a pet who appears healthy, as opposed to an examination of a pet who is ill. A wellness exam may also be called an annual check-up or a physical. Wellness exams are also used to establish Client-Patient-Veterinarian relationships. The focus of a wellness examination is the maintenance of optimal health. This exam includes a complete whisker-to-tail physical, nutrition evaluation, routine diagnostics to screen for diseases, administration of vaccinations, COHAT (dental) consultation and discussion of preventative measures to maintain the best health of your pet.

Vaccine Booster (Tech appt): \$15 injection fee

Nevada law requires an exam prior to prescribing any medication, including vaccines. Veterinary Technician vaccine appointments are available for patients who have established client-patient-veterinarian relationships with a Pet Network Community Hospital Veterinarian. This is a follow up appointment to administer the second vaccine of 2 part booster series. If you have not established care with a Pet Network Veterinarian please schedule a Wellness exam.

COHAT (dental) Consultations: \$79.00

COHAT stands for "Comprehensive Oral Health Assessment and Treatment." The term is used to describe veterinary dentistry procedures involving the examination and treatment of diseases of the mouth. This includes radiographic evaluation of all of the teeth, visual evaluation, and treatment of diseased teeth including extraction of severely diseased teeth. All COHAT procedures require an initial consultation.

During the consultation, we will:

- Review your pet's medical history
- Perform a full physical exam, head to tail
- Perform an oral exam
- Discuss the recommendations for your pet's dental health
- Generate a cost estimate for the COHAT procedure
- Discuss preoperative blood work
- Discuss the plan for the day of the procedure

COHAT procedures require full anesthesia to fully evaluate the mouth and administer treatment. We perform a physical exam during the consultation to make sure your pet is a good candidate for anesthesia and to determine the appropriate anesthesia protocol. A complete blood panel may be recommended or required prior to the COHAT procedure (not included in the exam fee). We require pre-anesthesia blood work on all dogs 7 years and older and cats 9 years and older. Pet Network Community Hospital has an in-hospital laboratory where blood work can be performed. We recommend running pre-anesthesia blood work at the time of the consultation so that we can identify, plan and address any health issues prior to the day the procedure is scheduled.

There is considerable variability among animals in the time required to fully address their dental health which can range from simple teeth cleaning to the extraction of all the teeth in the mouth. During the consultation, we provide an estimate for the cost to complete the recommended procedures. COHAT procedures start at \$380.00 for evaluation and cleaning under anesthesia and additional cost is based on the time and materials necessary to treat abnormalities. Surgical Consultations: \$89.00

Surgical consultations are required for all surgical procedures except spays and neuters. The goal of the surgical consultation is to evaluate your pet and to make sure they are good candidates for the procedure and for anesthesia. We will perform a full physical exam during this consultation and determine a surgical plan. We will discuss the nature of the procedure, expected outcomes, possible complications, and cost. We will also discuss the need for preoperative blood work and/or additional diagnostics. For a list of the surgical procedures we offer please see our surgical procedures page.

Spay/Neuter Procedures: See below for pricing

Spaying and neutering pets is important to help mitigate pet overpopulation, prevent unwanted pregnancies, and help your pet live a longer, healthier life! We offer spay/neuter services to the community at an affordable price. What you need to know when scheduling your pet for spay/neuter procedure:

- A non-refundable deposit of \$50 per pet is required at the time of scheduling all spay/neuter appointments. This deposit will be applied to your balance. In the event you do not show or fail to cancel or reschedule your appointment 48 hours prior, a surcharge of \$50 per pet will be applied to your account. This deposit will cover that fee.
- Pricing includes pre-anesthesia exam. e-collar and take home pain medication.
- Additional charges apply for blood work, overweight, in-heat, pregnancy, Inguinal Cryptorchid, Abdominal cryptorchid, & umbilical/hernia repair.

- Current vaccinations are required, if you do not have proof of vaccinations given by a licensed veterinarian, the appropriate vaccines will be given at the time of procedure for an additional cost. Self-administered vaccines are not accepted. All vaccines must have been administered by a licensed veterinarian.
- Consultation & blood work is required for all pets over the age of 7 years.
- Consultations are required for spay procedures on patients over 100lbs.
- All pets must be kept on leash or in a carrier while at our facility, if you do not have a cat carrier or leash you may purchase one for \$5.

Technician Services: Prices vary based on the service requested, please call for pricing.

Technician services are available for **established** patients. Established patients are patients who have been examined by a Pet Network Community Hospital Veterinarian (within 6 months).

- Vaccine boosters
- Injections Cytopoint, Adequan, B-12 (injection fee applies)
- Recheck blood work
- SQ fluids (subcutaneous, under the skin)
- Bandage changes
- Suture / Staple removal
- Anal sac expression
- Nail trim
- Deluxe nail trim (professional nail trim & grind)
- Ear cleaning
- Microchipping

Emergency Exams \$150.00: Any severe or life-threatening medical emergency requiring immediate treatment and medical care.

- Emergency services are subject to staff availability
- If possible please call before you arrive. Calling ahead allows our staff to prepare for your pet's arrival. Please bring all medical records and current medications if available.
- A \$600 deposit is required at the time of service to cover initial treatments to stabilize your pet (the exam fee is included in this deposit). Initial treatment may include, IV catheterization, fluid administration, blood work, rapid diagnostic tests, radiographs, emergency medications, and oxygen administration. Total costs may exceed this amount quickly in critical situations. Any deposit money not used in stabilization will be applied to additional services or refunded to the owner upon finalization of the invoice.
- Examples of conditions requiring emergency service include: respiratory distress, cardiac arrest, severe bleeding, loss of consciousness, ongoing seizure, severe allergic reactions, heat stroke, severe trauma, toxin ingestion, and bloat (i.e. gastric dilation and volvulus).
